INTRODUCTION

Do you have any favorite colors? Most people do. Sometimes the clothes I decide to wear each day are chosen because of the mood I'm in.

For me, colors affect and reflect my feelings. How about you? What color is your favorite t-shirt? If you're feeling sad or mad, will you put it on to make yourself feel better?

While writing FEETSPEAK, my main character Lucinda Amelia Ontarion, or Cinnamon, inspired me to Color-Code my chapters.

Her communication with others (and herself) by selecting a variety of colorful shoes helped me to use specific colors for setting different moods and feelings in each of the chapters.

For example, Chapter 3 ~ Red doesn't have a lot of red elements throughout its content, but Cinnamon is definitely "seeing red" during that sequence of events.

I have to say, it was fun corresponding the events of each chapter with different colors found in Nature, foods, surroundings, and, of course, her shoes.

CONSTRUCTION INSTRUCTIONS

MATERIALS: cardstock, printing paper, pencil, 3-hole and/or single hole-punch, binding (coil, comb, O-ring, stapler)

CONSTRUCTION: You may want to print the <u>Front/Back</u> <u>Covers</u> on cardstock & the pages on printing paper to bind together as a Master copy using the <u>Contents</u> list.

If you are collecting the Activities together in a notebook, use the covers as dividers or slip them in the pocket of a tabbed divider.

The <u>Color Palettes</u> and <u>Coloring Words</u> pages correspond with the order of the chapters in FEETSPEAK.

You can double-side copy the <u>Color Palettes</u> pages as well as the <u>Coloring Words</u> pages on cardstock and/or heavy printing paper.

Then, staple or O-ring the Palette pages together and/or the Coloring Words pages with their Answer Sheets. Put them in the pockets of a folder with a copy of FEETSPEAK.

You can, also, leave them in single sheets to use one at a time.

I have provided a <u>Blank Color Page Template</u> you can copy and color them instead of printing the colored ones.

ACTIVITIES SEQUENCE

The order of the Color Palettes and Coloring Words pages corresponds with the Chapters of FEETSPEAK.

Read the different color words on each <u>Color Palette.</u> Look them up in your crayon box or in a Color reference book. The web can help show the variety of hues for each color, too.

You may want to color a little circle besides each one to show you how many different shades there are for each color.


On the back of each Palette page, you can list objects you find with the specific color, draw images & color them, or cut out different images to glue to the back.

Of course. you don't have to do the <u>Coloring Words</u> activity in any order, but make sure you've completed the Palette page to match the Coloring Words chapter page you are going to analyze. You will need a copy of FEETSPEAK to help.

Read the Coloring Words direction sheet before you begin.

Try to imagine the different elements listed in each chapter sharing a different shade of the same color. Ask yourself why you chose it and how does it affect the story. If you're not satisfied ~ change it.

Think of other elements and their shades you could add to each chapter. Why did you add those things?





Adding color words to your writing can change the mood and expression of your thoughts you want to share: happy, gloomy, joyful, scary, hot, cold....


When writing FEETSPEAK, I decided to use colors as a way to communicate a variety of emotions and ideas.


